CHINESE POTENTIAL

We cannot speak of "Asia Pacific" without including China. The future of the Asia Pacific will have to include China. We are therefore very happy for the recent opportunities to minister among mainland and overseas Chinese.

Firstly, we were introduced to various Chinese-based churches in Australia where we were given standing invitations to return for ministry. Many of these churches are only just recognizing their responsibility in world missions.

Secondly, we started our International Chinese Service at the Baguio Assembly City Church. It is still a small church of about 15 people but already we are sensing its potential. There are some mainland Chinese attending the service but we are now praying for local Filipino churches to be reached.

Thirdly, we got to teach in 3 different training centers in Shanghai, Anhui and Zhejiang. Again, we have been given standing invitations to return. We also hosted leaders of the same network in KL in the middle of December. They looked at possibilities of placing their "Back to Jerusalem" missionaries in Malaysia and also for them to receive further theological training in Malaysia, especially at the Bible College of Malaysia.

This is an exciting development because we are now talking about releasing the potential of the 100-million-member Chinese Church. They are trying to become a full-fledged, giving partner in world missions. Let's come together and walk them through this transition. **Will you partner with us to do something?**
